Attendance

You may be aware from the newspapers and various media outlets that the Government is becoming increasingly concerned about the attendance of young people to school and our tightening of the rules and regulations around student attendance.

We are now legally required to inform the Local Authority's Attendance Team when a child has had the equivalent of 10 days' absence from school. The Local Authority is now legally required to intervene much earlier when a child's attendance reaches 10 days.

Whilst fines and court appearances will always be the last resort, both schools and Local Authorities are expected to impose these sanctions when all else fails.

Fortunately, through the work of schools' Attendance Teams and the support of parents, most attendance issues can be resolved before we need to resort to legal actions.

School of Character

On Tuesday 12th December, Links Hatfield were awarded the School of Character kite mark. This was a very proud moment for us and cements months of hard work from staff and students across the school. Character is intrinsically one of the key aspects of the education that we deliver at Links; we are helping to shape the whole being of all of our young people and encourage them towards making informed, positive choices throughout their lives. The staff deserve to be recognised warmly for their support and hard work in ensuring that character underpins the curriculum we deliver, the conversations we have with our pupils and the manner in which staff model character to our young people. Food Technology

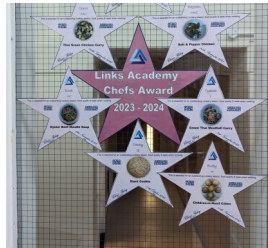

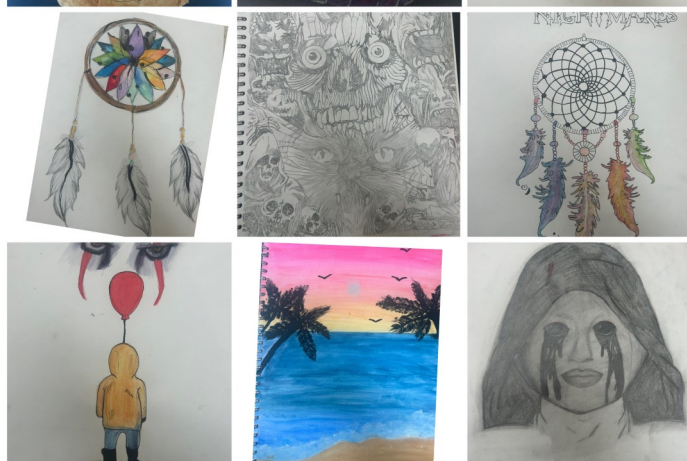
GCSE Art and Design



KS3 have been working on a 'Dreams' project this half term. Students have been studying the art movement of Surrealism and have begun researching the work of Rene Magritte. Students have successfully experimented with Magritte's style and techniques in order to complete their own surrealist art work. Students have engaged very well and have produced some interesting outcomes.

Year 10 Students have now begun their Art GCSE projects. This year they are exploring the theme of 'identity'. They have started by looking at their own identity and what Identity means to them and students are now beginning to explore identity within other cultures.

Students have explored a range of media and techniques and are working on applying a range of the formal elements to their art to create a range of outcomes.
